# LONG LAKE #58 FIRST NATION



Long Lake #58 First Nation community is located north of the Lake Superior 300 kilometers Northeast of Thunder Bay and 2 kilometers west of the Town Longlac off the TransCanada Highway #11 on the north Shore of Long Lake. Our total membership is approximately 1600 with 450 members residing in the community. The remainder of the membership resides outside the community across Canada with a majority of the members residing in Thunder Bay.

We are an Ojibway speaking First Nation and a member of the Anishinabek Nation and a member of the Matawa First Nation Management Group.

**Overview:** The Implementation Coordinator (IC) plays a critical role in managing and overseeing the relationship between Long Lake #58 First Nation (LLFN) and Greenstone Gold Mines (GGM) within the Project Development Area (PDA).

## **Implementation Coordinator**

Reporting to the Director of Operations, the Implementation Coordinator will be responsible for supporting Long Lake #58 First Nation in the implementation of various projects related to Long Lake #58 and Greenstone Gold Mines Implementation Committee.

- Provide updates to Implementation Committee and interact with other joint sub committees as necessary;
- Provide support to Long Lake # 58 First Nation in developing training, business and employment opportunities for the community;
- Contribute to the community's economic development plan;
- Continuously seek ways to streamline and improve processes;
- Promote the active participation of Long Lake # 58 First Nation members in all phases of the Project, through relevant programs and policies;
- Facilitate open communication between Long Lake # 58 First Nation and Greenstone Gold Mines;
- Provide updates to community members on project development.
