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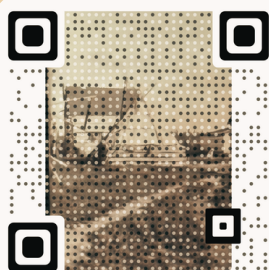

The Highway 11 (Hwy 11) Safety and Regional Implementation Table brings together Long Lake No. 58 First Nation (LL58 FN), the Province of Ontario and Industry partners to transition from urgent interim measures to permanent infrastructure improvements.

Phase 1

IMMEDIATE SAFETY MEASURES

A Light Restoration

Restoring Essential Lighting: crews are repairing damaged streetlights and planning new installations to improve visibility immediately.

B Interim Traffic Signs

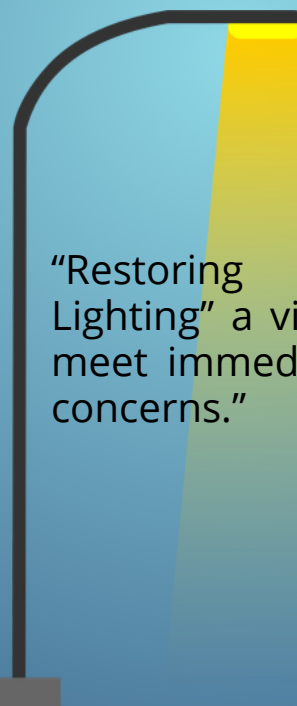
Interim Traffic Calming: portable electronic speed displays and enhanced warning signage have been deployed to alert motorists.

C Urgent Summer Protection

Temporary measures: the use of crossing guards is being explored to help protect the community during the peak summer months.

Migizi Schools on Long Lake #58 First Nation continues to explore meaningful ways to preserve historical knowledge and create opportunities for children and youth to understand their origins. It is grounded in the belief that knowing where you come from helps guide where you are going. As part of the history curriculum, a mapping project was undertaken this summer, inviting community members to identify where they once lived in areas such as the Point, Suckle Creek, and Antoine's. In collaboration with the Lands Department of Long Lake #58 First Nation and Four Rivers of Matawa Tribal Council, these contributions will support the development of maps that help tell the story of the community.

Claire Onabigon presented a digital photo display of the Point from 1965, featuring images captured by renowned photographer Freeman Patterson. Doug Bedwash contributed valuable insight into future curriculum development, encouraging community input on topics included. In addition, Council Member Mike Fisher shared his ongoing work documenting historical family areas within Long Lake. The rich history of Long Lake #58 First Nation inspires curiosity and must be preserved, honoured, and celebrated for generations to come. Moving forward, there is a shared goal to collaborate with Ginoogaming First Nation to develop similar mapping projects highlighting areas such as the Old Sawmill and early settlement sites.
